► Describe practicum trainee duties and responsibilities:

The practicum position emphasizes hands-on interaction with children and teens using a unique multimodal intervention process that begins with a thorough neuropsychological evaluation. EEG neurofeedback is the main treatment modality, with cognitive training and auditory integration as secondary modalities. Individual and family therapy are used on an as-needed basis for clients who display significant functional impairments which impede the effectiveness of neurotherapy.

Responsibilities include:

- 1. Administer computerized EEG assessment and Neurofeedback training according to Training Director, licensed psychologist approved protocols.
- 2. Participate in assessment using comprehensive computerized neuro-cognitive battery, Woodcock Johnson (and on an as needed basis, the WISC and WAIS, and selected additional neuropsychological tests), continuous performance testing with the Integrated Variables of Attention Test, interpret the ASEBA, STAR tests.
- 3. Provide comprehensive written reports including DSM-IV multiaxial diagnosis. Conduct cognitive training using Lexia, Learning Rx, Captain's Log. Accept direction by Center Director and local administrators.
- 4. Participate collaboratively in the assessment and training processes, including school-based consultation, such as IEP meetings. Conduct literature reviews and write up research findings as directed by the Center Director or the Clinical Director.
- 5. The position requires comfort with Windows based computers, and understand how to triage computer problems to administrators and managers.

Note: The position is NOT exclusively or primarily a psychotherapy training position; it emphasizes applied psychophysiological intervention as the primary treatment modality. There will however be opportunities to see several clients in therapy throughout the year.

Describe the Assessment Program: Quantitative EEG Assessment and Continuous Performance Testing (Integrated Variabes of Attention—IVA) begin the testing process. It continues with the Woodcock Johnson and/or a computerized battery of neurocognitive tests. Normed observational rating scales, (ASEBA) are used to develop a comprehensive view of client functioning, as well. Optionally, auditory processing tests will also be performed by the practicum student. Practicum students have opportunities to collaborate with IEP evaluations on-site at schools, as well. Students will have opportunities to perform comprehensive clinical and neuropsychological batteries, based on client and clinic needs.

VI. TRAINING/SUPERVISION PHILOSOPHY and OBJECTIVES: A. Please describe below.

In general, the supervision philosophy is that applied psychophysiology offers enormous opportunities for both growth of skills and remediation of deficits in human functioning. Well trained clinicians require handson experience with a variety of modalities that the Attention and Achievement Center specializes in.

The supervision process is didactic regarding the psychophysiological principles and practices required of the student. The psychotherapeutic orientation of the primary supervisor is systemic, informed by both behavioral and psychodynamic principles. Students are accorded respect for the individual, unique skills they bring to their work. The practicum offers each student the opportunity to excel in the use of a wide variety of skills. The great breadth of skills required of each student assures that each student has an opportunity both to develop skills in underemphasized areas while maximizing use of their strengths.
