#### III. AGENCY DESCRIPTION: Please describe below.

We are the Readjustment Counseling Services (RCS) in affiliation with the San Francisco Veterans Affairs Medical Center for the Department of Veterans Affairs. Our main focus of treatment at the Vet Center is Post-traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) which includes trauma related primarily to combat, sexual assault, and other readjustment problems which may present as a veteran attempts to readjust after rejoining civilian life. Any veteran male or female of any era who was sexually assaulted or harassed while on active duty will receive treatment here. We also provide bereavement counseling to family members who have lost relatives in the current Iran-Iraq conflict. We provide a wide range of services in support of this treatment. We provide psychological assessments on a case by case basis; individual, group, marital, and family therapy. General group therapy deal with depression, anger management, PTSD management, cognitive behavioral depression and anxiety groups. We also provide Relaxation training, and Substance Abuse Recovery Maintenance groups. We provide specialized Veterans groups for women, e.g. Women's Veterans Sexual Trauma Group. Other specialized groups provided are African-American, Asian American, Hispanic, Gay, and Lesbian and Senior individuals. We will provide other culturally sensitive groups as needed. We also provide community education on various issues. We network closely with other community agencies to provide assistance with basic needs of Homeless veterans. Employment and Benefits counseling are also provided.
