We have pediatric, OB/GYN, Family Medicine, Dental, Optometry, Prevention, Health Education, etc. Practicum is in our mental health department only. Contracts: Child abuse-active cases or at risk cases; HIV+/AIDS; domestic violence for women; Alameda Co. health department minors who are Spanish speakers; Alameda Co health department adults who are Spanish speakers and who either have a chronic mental illness or need crisis stabilization.
