The Y Team is a program of the YMCA of the East Bay that has been providing mental health services to young people in West Contra Costa County since 1984, through a joint effort of the YMCA, Contra Costa County Children's Mental Health and the WCCUSD. The Y Team provides individual, family, and group therapy to middle and high school students and their families. Most services are provided on-site at school campuses in West Contra Costa County. Services are also provided at the Y Team office near Hilltop Mall. The Y Team also provides counseling and case management service to pregnant and parenting teens, as well as case management services for families at risk or entering the child welfare system.
